~ Pattern designed to fit 5" Berenguer Play Dolls.

~ Pattern includes gown, panties & hat.

5" Berenguer Doll Gown Crochet Pattern

MATERIALS

- B crochet hook (2.25mm) or size #1 steel crochet hook
- Size 3 Paton's Grace Crochet Thread
 - Pink
 - White
- Yarn needle
- Small snap or other closure
- Thread & needle for snap
- Stitch marker or safety pin
- Coordinating ribbon (optional)
- Embellishments for gown & hat (optional)

STITCHES & ABBREVIATIONS USED

ch(s) = chain(s)
sc = single crochet
dc = double crochet
st(s) = stitch(es)
sl st = slip stitch
sp(s) = space(s)
hk = hook
Rnd(s) = Round(s)
FO = fasten off
(RS) = right side
BLO = back loops only
FLO = front loops only
grps = groups

PATTERN NOTES

* This pattern is worked both in Rows and in Rounds. While working in the round, you will need to mark the last stitch of the round with a stitch marker or safety pin to help keep your place. Only join rounds or rows when instructed to do so.

* Ch-3 counts as 1 dc stitch; ch-2 and ch-1 do *NOT* count as a stitch.

* *Note about 5" Berenguer Dolls.* I discovered that the newer 5" Berenguer Dolls that come in the knitted outfits are a little bit larger than the older 5" dolls. You may need to adjust your hook accordingly if you find the outfit not fitting.

Gauge:

B hk (2.25mm):

Special Stitches Used:

V-Stitch / V-St(s) = (dc, ch 1, dc) in same st or sp

Thread You Can Use:

* Royale Fashion Crochet Thread, Size 3

Note: If you use the above crochet threads, you may need to adjust your crochet hook size. Some size 3 crochet threads work up heavier than others.

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GOWN

Row 1: With MC thread, ch 19, work 2 sc in 2nd ch from hk and in each in ch across. (36 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, turn. Sc in same st as ch-1. Sc in next 5 sc, ch 5, skip next 6 sc, sc in next 12 sc, ch 5, skip next 6 sc, sc in last 6 sc. (24 sc)

Now is a good time to try the gown on the doll. If it is too small, try using a larger hook. If it is too big, try using a smaller hook.

Row 3: Ch 1, turn. Sc in same st as ch-1. Sc in each sc and in each ch across. (34 sc)

Row 4: Ch 1, turn. Sc in same st as ch-1. Sc in each sc across. (34 sc)

Row 5: Ch 1, turn. Working this row in BLO, sc in same st as ch-1. Sc in BLO of each sc across. (34 sc)

Change to CC thread.

Shell = (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in same st or sp

Row 6: Ch 3, turn. Dc in next sc. *Skip next sc, Shell in next sc, skip next sc, dc in next 2 sc*, repeat from * to * across. (6 Shells, 7 dc grps)

Row 7: Ch 3, turn. Dc in next dc. *Skip next 2 dc, Shell in next ch-2 sp, skip next 2 dc, dc in next 2 dc*, repeat from * to * across. (6 Shells, 7 dc grps)

Row 8: Repeat Row 7.

Rnd 9: Ch 3, turn. Dc in next dc. *Skip next 2 dc, Shell in next ch-2 sp, skip next 2 dc, dc in next 2 dc*, repeat from * to * across. Join with a sl st to the top of beginning ch-3. (6 Shells, 7 dc grps)

Rnd 10: Ch 3, (*do NOT turn*) dc in next dc. *Skip next 2 dc, Shell in next ch-2 sp, skip next 2 dc, dc in next 2 dc*, repeat from * to * around. Join with a sl st to the top of beginning ch-3. (6 Shells, 7 dc grps)

Rnd 11: Repeat Rnd 10.

Change to MC thread.

Rnd 12: Ch 1, sc in same st as ch-1. Work a sc in each dc around and work 2 sc in each ch-1 sp around. Join with sl st to first sc. (sc)

Rnd 13: Sc in each sc around. (sc)

Rnd 14: (*eyelet rnd for drawstring*) Ch 3, skip next 2 sc, sc in next sc*, repeat from * to * around. Join with a sl st to the first ch of beginning ch-3.

Rnd 15: Sl st into first ch-3 sp and work (ch 1, 3 sc). Work a sc in each sc around and work 3 sc in each ch-3 sp around. Join with a sl st to first sc. FO and weave in tails.

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SLEEVES

Second Sleeve

1. Repeat First Sleeve instructions.

GOWN RUFFLE

To Start: Holding gown upside down with the back of gown facing you, attach matching thread with a sl st to the **FRONT** loop of first st on left side of gown on Row 5.



Row 1: Working in FLO of Row 5, *ch 1, sl st in next sc*, repeat from * to * across. FO and weave in tails.

DRAWSTRING

If you don't want to make a drawstring, you can use coordinating ribbon instead.

1. Leaving a length of tail, with MC thread, ch 50.
2. Leaving a length of tail again, cut yarn and pull through loop on hk.

3. Using yarn needle, weave drawstring through Rnd 13.

4. Knot ends of drawstring and cut tails off. You can add a dab of clear drying craft glue to the ends of drawstring to keep the ends from fraying.

FINISHING GOWN

1. Sew snap or other closure on gown.
2. Embellish gown as desired with flowers, buttons, etc.

HAT

Rnd 1: With MC thread, ch 4, work 5 dc in 4th ch from hk. Join with a sl st to 3rd ch of beginning ch-4. (6 dc)

Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in same st as ch-3. Work 2 dc in each dc around. Join with a sl st to top of ch-3. (12 dc)

Rnd 3: Ch 3. In same st as ch-3 work (dc, ch 2, 2 dc). *Skip next dc, Shell in next dc*, repeat from * to * around. Join with a sl st to top of ch-3. (6 Shells)

Rnd 4: Sl st over and into first ch-2 sp and work (ch 3, dc, ch 2, 2 dc). Work Shell in each ch-2 sp around. Join with sl st to top of ch-3. (6 Shells)

Rnd 5: Repeat Rnd 4.

Rnd 6: Ch 1, sc in same st as ch-1. Work a sc in each dc around and work 2 sc in each ch-2 sp around. Join with a sl st to first sc. FO and weave in tails.

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FLOWER FOR HAT

To Start: With CC thread, ch 6, join with a sl st to first ch to form ring.

Rnd 1: *Ch 2, 2 dc in ring, ch 2, sl st in ring*, repeat from * to * 4 more times to create a total of 5 petals. Leaving a length of tail for sewing, FO.

To Finish Hat: Embellish center of flower with a button, bead or whatever you like. Using tail and yarn needle, sew the flower to the hat in desired position.
